**PLAN OF ACTION CHALKED OUT IN THE BEGINNING OF  
THE YEAR 2007-08 TOWARDS QUALITY ENHANCEMENT**

For the year 2007-08 IQAR's plan of action included:

- a) Further efforts to improve the quality of the college as per the suggestions given by the NAAC Peer Team.

b) At the College level certain activities were planned aiming at further quality enhancement. These included:

1. Introduction of new courses

Implementation of new courses that have received approval from the authorities:

Under Graduate Level:

- a) Diploma in Hindi Translation.
- b) Certificate Course in English.
- c) Advanced C training programme and Advanced C ++ Programming.
- d) Certificate course in maintenance of audiovisual equipments.

2. Follow up on Research Centres:

Further attempts to obtain permission from the University of Pune to start a research centre in Commerce.

3. Infrastructure Development:

The College has planned to add the following infrastructure during year:

- a) Four classrooms
- b) A new staff room

c) Two labs for organic chemistry

d) Two rooms for YCMOU

4. Library:

a) Completion of the computerization of library and moving towards 'e' library.

b) Subscribing additional research journals in various subjects.

5. Instrumentation facility: Plans are made for setting up advanced instrumentation facility in the department of Physics.

6. Grants under FIST: The College plans to re-apply for grants under FIST (Funds for Improvement of Science and Technology) for Department of Microbiology and submit a fresh application for grants for Geography and Botany departments. Grants under FIST have already been sanctioned for Physics, Chemistry and Zoology departments.

7. Follow up on proposals to: Implementation of the infrastructure plan, a ladies hostel with 50 plus rooms with modern amenities, for which UGC grants have been received.

8. Computer Network Centers: In Biochemistry, Biotechnology, Mathematics, Statistics and Geography departments.

9. Office Automation: Fine tuning of office automation for fully online admissions procedure, including PG Science admissions.

10. College Website: Improvements in the websites with special link up for alumni online registration.

11. Renovation and Upgradation:

- a. Renovation of Ladies common room.
- b. Renovation of Gents Common room.
- c. Further upgradation of Gymnasium.

#### d. OUTCOME BY THE END OF THE YEAR

##### 1. Introduction of new courses

During the year 2007-08, the College successfully introduced many value added courses. At the undergraduate level three courses having affiliation to University of Pune, were started, viz. Diploma in Hindi Translation, Certificate Course in English, Certificate Course in Advanced C and Advanced C ++ Programming. Many students enrolled for these courses and successfully completed them. Another course, Certificate Course in Maintenance of Audiovisual Equipments, for which permission from the University of Pune was obtained during this year will start in the next academic year.

##### 2. Follow up on Research Centres:

The College has obtained permission from the University of Pune to start a research centre in Commerce. Registration for doctoral research has already begun. In the coming academic year the College plans to start M.Phil. program in Commerce.

##### 3. Infrastructure Development:

During this academic year the College has added four classrooms to the available infrastructure. In addition the College now has a new staff room. Two Organic Chemistry labs have

been set up and have become operational. Further, two rooms have been built for use for the YCMOU centre in the College.

4. Library:

During the year further work has been done in our pursuit of setting up 'e-library. Work on computerization is in progress. The library has continued to enrich its collections. This year, 4990 new books were bought and 22 new research journals in various subjects have been subscribed.

5. Instrumentation facility:

An advanced instrumentation facility has been set up in the department of Physics. This is now in use both for research and the practicals of the undergraduate and postgraduate classes.

6. Grants under FIST:

Grants obtained under FIST for Physics, Chemistry and Zoology departments are being well utilized. The utilization for the first installment has been sent to the DST.

7. Computer Network Centers:

Computer network centers have been opened in Biochemistry and Geography departments. Soon this facility will be extended to Biotechnology, Mathematics, and Statistics departments.

8. Office Automation:

The College this year continued its efforts at streamlining the process of office automation and move towards fully online admissions procedure. Work is in progress in this regard. There is some more ground to cover.

9. College Website:

The design and content of the website of the College has been revised. The information displayed has been updated.

10. Renovation and Upgradation:

This year the Ladies and the Gents common rooms have been renovated. College undertook the further upgradation of Gymkhana.

These steps, it is hoped, would help in the quality enhancement in the college and benefit the students by enabling them to have quality education.

**PART – B:****1. Activities reflecting the goal and objectives of the institution:****Some of the activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution include: -****a) Research:**

The College believes that core research is an important step towards quality in education. Hence, the staff are always encouraged to undertake research work. Thus several staff members are pursuing major or minor research work. The College currently has 21 Ph.D. and M.Phil guides, 45 students have registered for Ph.D. and 61 for M.Phil. This includes the 21 students registered for M.Phil. course in Marathi.

In all nine students have completed their doctorate degree and one has completed his M.Phil. degree during the year.

**b) Introduction of new courses: -**

Considering the current needs of the students and the local community, new Certificate courses have been introduced.

**c) Hostel facilities:**

The College has started work on the new hostel for women being built with the grant received for the purpose from the UGC.

d) Other activities: -

The inclusive admission policy of the College encourages girls, minorities, and out of state students to join our institution. During the year the College gave admission to about 879 students from the minority communities which was about 23% of the total enrolment. Out of the total enrolment about 1381 were girls which is approximately 36%. About --- out-of-state students were given admission.

The College also made scholarship available to about 1577 needy students. These scholarships are in various categories.

Staff involved in the preparation of a new textbook for a UG course in Soft skills for the University of Pune.

- b) Department of Mathematics: Contributory teaching at B.Sc. Biotech courses and vocational Biotech courses.
- c) Department of Zoology: Collaboration with the University of Regensburg, Germany, for an exchange program of students and scholars in Chronobiology.
- d) Department of Botany: Contributory teaching at B.Sc. Biotech courses and vocational Biotech courses.

e) Department of Physics has tie-ups with MIRC for developing training aids and with VRDE, for research.

In continuation of the new examination system, this year at B.A. and B.Com. undergraduate level a term end examination of 20 marks was conducted and the final examination will be of 80 marks conducted by the University of Pune.
